Congregation Beth Israel (CBI) was established in 1998. CBI is a welcoming Reform Jewish community that serves individuals and families in the Dallas-Fort Worth metro area. We are a home for spiritual awareness, education, and growth. CBI believes in interfaith inclusion and transforming Jewish isolation through engagement, participation, and volunteerism. Embracing the Jewish traditions of *L'Dor V'Dor* (linking generation to generation) and *Tikkun Olam* (repair the world) allows CBI to nurture meaningful relationships and a profound sense of belonging. Your support tonight will enable CBI to continue to offer life changing programs as well as provide for significant infrastructure improvements for our congregation.



As an integral service arm of the Jewish Federation of Fort Worth and Tarrant County, Jewish Family Services (JFS) offers individual and family counseling as well as support groups to the entire community. JFS also helps coordinate a Senior Adult Lunch Program where approximately 150 hot meals are served each week. JFS also helps members of our community who, from time to time, may need some help to fulfill their basic needs, such as food and shelter. Locally, JFS opened an office to offer services in Colleyville for members of CBI and the community as a whole regardless of religion or ethnicity. GRACE is a faith-based, non-profit relief agency that provides food, clothing, and other emergency assistance to people who are in need in Grapevine, Colleyville, Southlake or other Northeast Tarrant County communities. Extended resources through transitional housing and case management are directed toward developing self-sufficiency. Compassion and assistance are offered as a response to God's grace in partnership local churches, municipalities, businesses, civic organizations, and individuals.

any required knowledge that the Internal Revenue Service had given notice that you would no longer be classified as a section 501(c)(3) organization.

Does any federal contribution to you as provided in section 170 of the Code (charitable, religious, scientific, or educational) or for your use are deductible for federal income tax purposes if they meet the applicable provisions of Code sections 170(e), 170(f), and 170(g).

Contribution deductions are allowable to donors only to the extent that their contributions are gifts, with an exception provided. These provisions and certain payments in conjunction with fundraising events may not necessarily qualify as deductible contributions, depending on the circumstances. See Revenue Ruling 87-248, published in Cumulative Bulletin 87-2, or page 18, which sets forth guidelines regarding the deductibility of charitable contributions. If payments made by taxpayers for admission to an entertainment participation in fundraising activities are charity.

In the heading of this letter we have indicated whether you must file Form 990. Unless an organization reports Form 990-E, if the 990-E, you are required to file Form 990 only if your gross receipts each year are generally more than \$10,000. However, if you receive a Form 990 package on the mail, please file the return even if you do not exceed the gross receipts limit. If you are not required to file, simply attach the label provided, check the box in the heading to indicate that your annual gross receipts are normally \$10,000 or less, and sign the return.

If a return is required, it must be filed by the 15th day of the fifth month after the end of your annual reporting period. A penalty of \$25 a day is charged when a return is filed late, unless there is reasonable cause for the delay. However, the maximum penalty charged cannot exceed \$1,000 or 5 percent of your gross receipts for the year. Whether it is late, the organization that gross receipts exceeding \$10,000 in any year, the penalty is \$100 per day per return, unless there is reasonable cause for the delay. The maximum penalty for an organization with gross receipts exceeding \$1,000,000 shall not exceed \$10,000. This penalty may also be charged if a return is not complete, so be sure your return is complete before you file it.

The law requires you to make your annual return available for public inspection without charge for three years after the due date of the return. You are also required to make available for public inspection a copy of your complete application, any supporting documents and this complete letter to any individual who requests such documents in person or in writing. You are always only a reasonable fee for reproduction and annual postage costs for the copies received. The law does not require you to provide copies of public inspection documents that are made widely available, such as by posting them on the Internet (websites) or by e-mail. You may be liable for a penalty of \$10 a day for each day you do not make these documents available for public inspection up to a maximum of \$10,000 in the case of an annual return.
